

CALVIN WARREN COULTER, 63, of Little Rock passed away Dec. 25, 2003. He was the son of Randall and Sue Coulter, who are both deceased. He is survived by his twin brother, Wayman; his nephew, Travis; and many loving relatives and friends.

He graduated from Central High School, 1957, in Little Rock, completed his bachelor's degree at Little Rock University, and his law degree at the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville. He was in the United States Navy Reserves for 27 years; five of those years were on activity duty and included two tours in Vietnam during the war. His last position in the service was Commander of a Reserve Naval SEAL Unit in Fort Smith, Ark. He recently retired after a long and successful career as an attorney at law.
