

GEORGE POLYCHRON, 49, of 9 Millbrook Court, a needlepoint artist who was one of the first people to graduate from high school with the help of the Pilot Club Program, died Wednesday, June 25, 1986.

Polychron was stricken with a spinal ailment in 1952. After months of hospitalization and special care, he re-entered school by studying and communicating with his class from home with the aid of a communication system provided by the Little Rock Pilot Club. He graduated from Little Rock Central High School in 1957.

Polychron also attended Little Rock University (now the University of Arkansas at Little Rock) and was a member of Phi Alpha Beta fraternity.

He was a member of the Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church, where he was a past board member and served as treasurer.

Trisagion service will be at 7:30 p.m. today at Griffin Leggett Healy & Roth. Funeral will be at 2 p.m. Friday at Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church.
