

ROSEMARY MILLWEE BREWER, wife of Silas H. Brewer, Jr., died Sunday, December 11, 1994 after a long and valiant battle against cancer. She was fifty-five. A social studies teacher for twenty-seven years, she taught at Hall High, Little Rock Central High, and Southwest Junior High School. She was a three-time fellow of the National Geographic Society, having been selected for National Geographic seminars in Africa, California and the Dominican Republic. She was an inspiration in her teaching, and in her living, to students, friends and family.

The daughter of Arkansas Supreme Court Justice Minor W. Millwee and Grace Tribble Millwee of Horatio and DeQueen, Mrs. Brewer attended the Little Rock public schools, Mary Washington College in Fredericksburg, Virginia and the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville, where she was a member of Chui Omega Sorority. She earned a Masters degree in History from the University of Arkansas before returning to Little Rock to teach.

Mrs. Brewer was preceded in death by her parents and by a sister, Sylvia Millwee Mertens of Norman, Oklahoma. She is survived by her husband; by her daughters, Rebecca Brewer Spohn, a Ph.D. candidate at Memphis State University, and Allison Brewer, a law student at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock; and by a sister, Emily Millwee Bowles of Baltimore, Maryland.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday, 11 a.m. at the Second Presbyterian Church. Burial will be at Roselawn Memorial Park. Visitation will be at Ruebel Funeral Home from 6-8 p.m. today. Memorials may be made to the American Cancer Society or to Second Presbyterian Church.
